

Farnborough Safer Neighbourhoods Team offer free cycle coding

Officers from the Farnborough Safer Neighbourhoods Team are holding a free cycle coding day on Saturday, March 27 from 12pm until 2pm at King George V Pavilion, North Camp.

The purpose of the coding day is to encourage members of the community to keep their bikes safe and secure and make it easier to reunite them with their cycle should it be stolen.

Residents are invited to come and receive crime prevention advice and have their bike coded for free. It only takes a few moments and could help identification should the cycle be recovered.

PCSO Jennifer Lawrence, from the Farnborough Safer Neighbourhoods Team, said: "This is a really good opportunity for people to come along and get their bikes codes for free. Getting a good cycle lock and having your bike marked are just two ways to keep your bicycle safe. Also, keep a note of the bicycle frame number and store a digital photograph of the bike, even if it is just on a mobile phone."
